Breage Parish Council has been developing the '20 is Plenty' Project in conjunction with Vision Zero South West. This is a project between a number of organisations across Devon and Cornwall. The one thing we all share is a commitment to cut the number of serious road injuries across our area.

Breage Parish Council has recently supplied Hi Vis jackets to Godolphin Primary School children and to Breage C of E Primary school teachers to keep them safe on their journeys to and from school. The children have also been given "Be Bright Be Safe" Book Bag stickers and have attended Road Safety sessions with our Police Community Support Officer, Julia Berry.

You may have spotted numerous '20 is Plenty' road signs around our Parish, provided by Breage Parish Council with a view to helping motorists understand that particularly where people are, speeds should be cut to 20mph.
